

CARE INSTRUCTIONS USER GUIDE

Best Practices For Laundering Hospitality Blanket Inserts



INITIAL SORTING

Sort textiles by fabric and fill type to ensure each fabric receives the correct washing treatment. Inserts with down alternative fill should be washed separately from items with feather fill.



SPOT TREATMENTS

Identify and treat stained textiles with a mild spot treatment before loading into the washing machine for best results.



WASH CYCLE

Machine wash Warm at 105°F/40°C, then proceed with the Normal wash cycle. We suggest loading to 70%– 80% of rated capacity for proper saturation and rinsing.

Use high-quality, industrial-grade detergents designed for commercial laundries and formulated to handle large loads and tough stains.



DRYING CYCLE

Tumble dry Low at 120°F/49°C on Normal Cycle. We recommend loading to 70% – 80% of rated capacity, so that the inserts have free movement. Make sure inserts are completely dry before unloading, rotating as needed during the cycle for consistent results.



BLEACH

Use non-chlorine bleach sparingly, and as needed. To prevent damaging the fabric, do not apply bleach directly to stains.



STORAGE

Store the laundered inserts in a cool, clean and dry environment.



LONGEVITY

Handle inserts with care and pair with a duvet cover or triple sheeting method when making the bed for added protection.

HELPFUL TIPS

- **Use Appropriate Detergents:** Choose detergents specifically formulated for commercial use to ensure effective cleaning and fabric care. Contact your chemical supplier for recommendations on wash formulas.
- **Don't Overload Machines:** Overloading washing machines can lead to inadequate cleaning and increased wear and tear on textiles.
- **Perform Regular Maintenance:** Regularly maintain and clean laundry equipment to ensure optimal performance and prevent contamination.
- **Don't Use Excessive Chemicals:** Excessive use of harsh chemicals can damage fibers and reduce the lifespan of a textile.
